Science:

Children will learn to describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene.

They will also find out observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants.

Art / Design and Technology:

Children will improve their knowledge of drawing and painting to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination. This will include opportunities for observational drawing and using watercolours for painting fruit and vegetables. They will also use the basic principles of a healthy eating to prepare food and to understand where food comes from.

Social, emotional aspects of learning: New Beginnings, Growth Mindset, P4C class discussion sessions,

Geography:

Children will name and locate the world's 7 continents and 5 oceans through researching what foods grow there. They will also begin to develop their ability to use and interpret world maps, atlases and globes to identify countries, continents and oceans.

Computing:

Children will develop their independence with logging on and loading programs. They will also explore using the different features of Microsoft Word.

PE:

Children will be developing their team building skills through competitive games with Mr Brown this half term. They will also be improving their gymnastics skills with PBE.
