## **So what do we do for 1-2 hours when we get together?**

Last time we looked at what the Standards Committee do, this time it is the turn of Foundation.

The Foundation Committee is a team of 3 governors, chaired by Jen Ball, who work with the Headteacher to ensure the school maintains and develops its distinctive Christian character and we monitor Collective Worship, Leadership & Management and RE within this context. We have a special interest in admissions, equalities and helping the school to meet the obligations of the Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS). Last term when we met we looked at progress made in the RE action plan, discussed broadening our faith based admissions criteria and planned trips to St John's Church for year 6 and the new Year R.
